Dear IMMS UK (Founder) Branch Member and Corporate Member,

I do hope the following news will be of interest to you; please pass on this information to other IMMS members you may know who do not have access to Email.

We regret to record the death, on 21 March, of Lieutenant-Colonel (Rtd) George Evans OBE, President *Emeritus* of our UK (Founder) Branch.

As Director of Music at The Royal Military School of Music, Colonel George was instrumental in arranging that our branch meetings should take place at Kneller Hall. In his role as Branch President he maintained a close interest in Branch matters, in recognition of which he was appointed President *Emeritus* when he relinquished the presidency.

The Colonel's funeral was private; a memorial service is to be arranged and details will be announced in due course. A full obituary will appear in the June issue of our Newsletter.

1. Tuesday 26 April

Rachel looks forward to welcoming you to the Guards Chapel, and hopes you will join her and her colleagues after the concert for light refreshments in the Guards Museum.

2. Friday 29 April

On 1 April the Ministry of Defence released the details and range of ceremonial military personnel who will take part in the wedding of HRH Prince William of Wales and Miss Catherine Middleton on Friday 29 April. For your interest and information, a summary of the press release follows:

Queen's Guard

The 1st Bn Irish Guards will be providing the Queen's Guard at Buckingham Palace, St James's Palace and the Tower of London throughout the day. The Guard will turn out of the departure of the Royal Family from Buckingham Palace to Westminster Abbey.

Guard of Honour

A Guard of Honour comprising three officers and 101 other ranks from the Welsh Guards will be positioned in the forecourt of Buckingham Palace for the return of the members of the Royal Family.

Street Liners

More than 1,000 military personnel and military musicians will line the route from Westminster Abbey to Buckingham Palace. They will be made up of officers and other ranks from -

Inside Westminster Abbey: 8 Household Cavalry State Trumpeters, drawn equally from <u>The Life Guards</u> and the Blues and Royals

Royal Air Force *At Horse Guards Avenue/Whitehall* - The Central Band of the Royal Air Force

Inside Westminster Abbey - 8 RAF Fanfare trumpeters

Path Lining outside Westminster Abbey after Service

Personnel from each of the three Services will form a Path Lining party for when the couple leave Westminster Abbey. They are being chosen from a combination of those with a personal connection to Prince William, and those who have given an outstanding contribution to their service.

Sovereign's Escort and Captain's Escort

The Life Guards and Blues and Royals of the Household Cavalry Mounted Regiment will form a Sovereign's Escort for Her Majesty The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh, and a

Captain's Escort for the Bride and Groom, as the wedding party travels to Buckingham Palace from Westminster Abbey. This will involve some 160 horses.

Flypast

At 13 30 a flypast will take place over Buckingham Palace. This will consist of the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight's Lancaster, a Spitfire and a Hurricane, followed 30 seconds after by two Typhoons and two Tornado GR4s in box formation.

3. Saturday 30 April

The Band of the Scots Guards (Director of Music: Major D.D. Robertson) will be giving a concert in the Guards Chapel at Wellington Barracks on Saturday 30 April starting at 19 00. Admission to the concert is free, and there will be a retiring collection.

4. Thursday 5 May and Thursday 12 May

The Royal Military School of Music, Kneller Hall, has extended an invitation to IMMS members to two Beating Retreats which are to take place at the School on Thursdays 5 and 12 May. These parades are a new introduction and they are formal assessments for the 3rd year Student Bandmasters. The assessments are over two evenings with two candidates each evening.

The arrangements for the evenings are as follows:

- 18 00 Warrant Officers', Sergeants' & Students' Mess Bar opens for pre retreat drinks.
- 18 25 Move to the main square via Museum
- 18 30 Candidate No. 1 Marches on (Beating Retreat No.1 on 5 May, No.3 on 12 May).
- 19 00 Retreat ends, comfort break.
- 19 10 Move to the main square via Museum.
- 19 15 Candidate No. 2 Marches on (Beating Retreat No. 2 on 5 May, No.4 on 12 May).

Both the Officers' Mess and the Warrant Officers', Sergeants' & Students' Mess have been invited so it is expected to be well attended. We must limit, therefore, the number of IMMS members who can attend each evening, and it may be necessary to limit attendance to one evening. It is unclear at this moment whether chairs will be laid out or if it will be standing spectators only.

I will allocate places on a first-come first-served basis. As I do not have the daily opportunity to access e-mails, it would be immensely helpful if members would apply by post only, with the customary self-addressed envelope for reply.

We are immensely grateful to Colonel Cuthbert Brown, Major Tim Arnold and WO1 Mark Wilson for their generous invitation to us to attend these Beat Retreats.

5. Tuesday 24 May to Thursday 26 May

President and Mrs Obama will be making a State Visit to the United Kingdom between Tuesday 24 May and Thursday 26 May.

6. Sunday 5 June

The Band of the American Army and the Band of The Coldstream Guards will be performing in The Guards Chapel, starting at 5pm. Admission will be £15, which includes a glass of wine. Tickets will be available by post from the Guards Toy Soldier Centre on 020 7976 0850, or in person from the Toy Soldier Centre or The Guards
